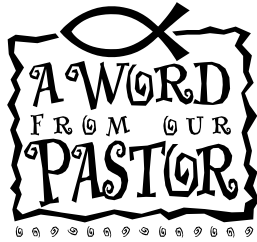

PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear Friends,

It has been my observation that all great spiritual people, all of the great praying people of the world, have been simple, relaxed people. There seems to be a misunderstanding that to develop a life with God, a spiritual life, that one must fret and strain at prayer, work hard at the devotional life.

Jesus cautions that zeal in spiritual matters can become all consuming and that it is easy for one to lose focus and concentrate on the wrong things. When we work too hard at anything, faith included, it becomes more about us and less about God; more about our progress and less and less about our drawing near to God. As a wise person once said, "Don't cut too deeply, don't carve too hard, don't paint the picture too much yourself. Get still awhile, and let God paint it through you." The sculptor Gutzon Borglum once wrote, "When I carve a statue, it is very simple. I merely cut away the pieces that don't belong there and the statue itself presently comes into view. It was there all the time."

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

God is in us and around us all of the time, and the task of the spiritual life, the challenge of faith, is to be still and let God remove the pieces that don't belong. The key is being still long enough and often enough to let God work.

So relax. Give it a try. It does work.

CHURCH COUNCIL UPDATE

August 10, 2010 Meeting

- Church finances continue to run as anticipated. All committees are reminded to carefully manage their budgets. Committees should submit a 2011 draft budget to Barbara Baker by August 23, 2010.
- The part-time Organist Search Committee found and recommended a candidate to Council for consideration. Mr. Les Ackerman, Jr. was presented and his credentials were reviewed. After discussion Council approved moving forward into negotiations with Mr. Ackerman.
- The Congregation Council Candidates Nominating Committee for October's election work is currently underway and they are developing a slate of candidates.
- SMLC successfully housed a group of homeless women for the Center of Hope program from August 2 through August 9, 2010. Thank you to the Social Ministry Committee, Susan League and to the numerous volunteers who stepped forward to assist. Thank you to Catherine Metze for leading this effort.
- Council is currently formulating a new Fundraising Policy. In the interim and until this policy is enacted and shared with the Congregation, any additional or new fundraising efforts need to be brought before Council for review and approval at least three months prior to implementation.

Council members will be held at that time.**



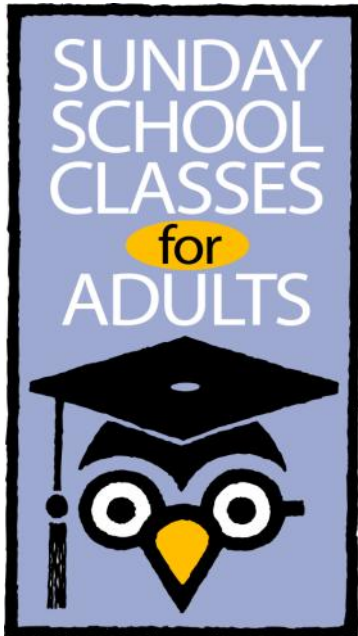

SOCIAL MINISTRY



Our one week commitment to house 11 ladies from **CENTER OF HOPE WOMEN'S SHELTER** in early August is concluded and deemed a success by all involved. We definitely touched them with our warmth and compassion, great food and convenient facilities. **BUT**, they touched us as well with their strong faith, their sincere gratitude and their pleasant individual personalities.

Room in the Inn is a very caring way of assisting the homeless, as is serving at "the wall" or at the Uptown Shelter. But having these homeless ladies share our facility and experience our Christian love for an entire week was a very moving, eye-opening experience, for them and for all volunteers involved.

It made us at St. Mark's acutely aware of the sad fact that homeless people are just like you and me with feelings, hopes and dreams of a bright productive future. The only difference between us and them is that we have a place to go home to at the end of the day - a safe haven away from the disappointments and struggles of the day. But for the thousands of Charlotte homeless it may mean sleeping on a mattress in an over-crowded shelter, a "step up" and assigned to a church such as St. Mark's, or unfortunate enough to spend the end of a weary day on a park bench or under a bridge, braving the elements and God only knows what else!

We can pat ourselves on the back for making the lives of these 11 ladies so much better for 7 days, then go back to our comfort levels and consider the job finished. **OR**, we can decide to join the Social Ministry Committee, volunteer at one of the area shelters, or increase our pledge so that the Social Ministry Committee can increase their budget to be able to spread more assistance to the agencies trying to improve living conditions for the unfortunate struggling thousands right here in our backyard. We don't have to send our money overseas to aid people who are down and out and in need of assistance, there are plenty right here under our noses!

THANK YOU to the approximately 36 volunteers who filled 86 jobs and made Center of Hope week possible, and to many others who made donations and offered prayers. We all truly answered God's plea to "love our neighbors as ourselves". Let's keep that compassion going and growing!

Due to circumstances beyond our control, St. Mark's will **NOT** be participating in a fall Thrivent/Lutheran **HABITAT FOR HUMANITY** build. Hopefully next year we can again be involved in this important, and fun, ministry. There are some builds still proceeding and refurbishing of existing vacant homes. Stephen Ministry
Is Here For You



How Does Stephen Ministry Work?

Has this ever been your question? You hear the name and see it in print, but you've often wondered how Stephen Ministry works. Here is an explanation.

When someone requests a Stephen Minister, whether by talking with either Pastor Emily or with Pastor Brown or with one of the people you know to be a Stephen Minister, that person's name is given to the Stephen Leader who functions as the Referrals Coordinator. The Referrals Coordinator will meet with that person, explain what Stephen Ministry is, and help determine whether Stephen Ministry is the kind of care that person needs.

The Referrals Coordinator then matches that person with one of our available Stephen Ministers. The Stephen Minister will then call that person and begin meeting with him or her for around an hour each week as long as the need is there.

Everything a care receiver says to his or her Stephen Minister is kept confidential. The Stephen Minister doesn't try to solve problems; rather, he or she listens, cares, prays, and helps the care receiver find his or her path to healing and wholeness.

If you have an interest in this program and the services it provides, please speak with one of the pastors or with one of the Stephen Ministers. For your convenience, a contact number is printed in each Sunday's bulletin.

And here is another reminder: if you know of someone who is not a member of this congregation but you believe that they would benefit from this ministry, please talk with that person about the ministry, ask if you may make a referral on their behalf, and with their permission, contact one of the pastors (704-375-9185) or Stephen Leader, Sarah Ingle (704-529-6656). After the referral, the process moves along in the way outlined above.
