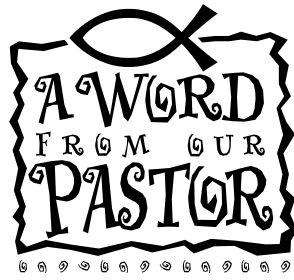

" GROWING DISCIPLES - MAKING CHRIST KNOWN "

PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear Family and Friends of Saint Mark's,

Many of you know that I often refer to the etymology (origin) of words in my sermons, be it Latin, Greek, Hebrew, German or English. Understanding the root of a word enhances the language and helps to clear up possible misunderstandings. So it is with this in mind that I bring you the Old English word "bisig." My etymology resources explain it as such:

O.E.(Old English) bisig "careful, anxious, busy, occupied," cognate with O.Du.(Old Dutch) bezich, Low Ger. (Low German) besig; no known connection with any other Germanic or Indo-European language. Still pronounced as in M.E. (Middle English), but for some unclear reason the spelling shifted to -u- in 15c. (15th century). The word was a euphemism for "sexually active" in 17c. Of telephone lines in 1893. In M.E., sometimes with a sense of "prying, meddling," preserved in "busybody." Busy work is first recorded in 1910.

Okay, so now that you have had your etymology lesson what's the point? It's this. Week after week, month after month, Pastor Emily and I run into people from St. Mark's who have gone through some problems and issues with which we could help, be it spiritual, health related, or just "life stuff," as I refer to it. When we ask why they did not come to us we are told, "Well, I know you are so busy, I just didn't want to bother you." Some times we hear, "You have so much to do that I really didn't want to take up your time."

*Let me put this as gently, but as firmly as possible: **we are never too busy that you cannot come to us.** Part of our job is being available when you need us. As the Old English definition states, there are times when we are "careful, anxious, busy and occupied," but we are never **too busy** for anyone. By definition we are shepherds (that's what pastor means—another etymology lesson) and no shepherd is too busy to attend to the needs of a sheep. I cannot conceive of a shepherd in Israel being told, "One of your sheep is in trouble," and having him reply, "I'm too busy, right now." The sheep are the shepherd's life. In the same way, as strange as it sounds, you, the people of St. Mark's are our life. Without you we have no jobs. We need you and at times you need us. And when you do remember that we are never too busy to help.*

So the next time you need one of your pastors and catch yourself thinking, "They're too busy," smack yourself (I might if I hear it again or find it out!).

Know that we love you and that it is our great honor to serve you and serve with you. Call us or call on us at any time.

February 7, 2011 Meeting

- We are only in the first month of the new year and financially we have gotten off to a solid start.
- The Youth Transportation Policy dated February 7, 2011 was approved. The Chaperone Policy of St. Mark's Lutheran Church Policy dated February 7, 2011 was approved.

Thursday July 28 through July 31, 2011

St. Mark's has again reserved the beach front Kure Beach Lutheran Retreat Center for an extended weekend this coming summer. The weekend is an informal and unstructured getaway with family fun, fellowship and relaxation. We will depart Thursday and return Sunday afternoon. It is open to all members but space is limited. The cost for three nights accommodation is approximately \$225 per room. (This cost will vary depending upon how many folks participate. Last year's cost was somewhat lower). Guestrooms typically sleep three, several are "adjoining" and can be paired if so desired. The guestrooms are air-conditioned. They are built around an open air central deck/seating area and each has one twin bed and a bunk bed. Each guestroom has a private toilet and sink. Separate private shower rooms are shared between two guestrooms. There is a large air conditioned, common dining/kitchen/activities room for all to share where we take meals and have activities..

Last year's trip was great fellowship, relaxation and lots of sun. It gave many of us time to get to know members we otherwise would not have had a chance to meet and spend time with.

St. Mark's Financial Status as of January 31st, 2010

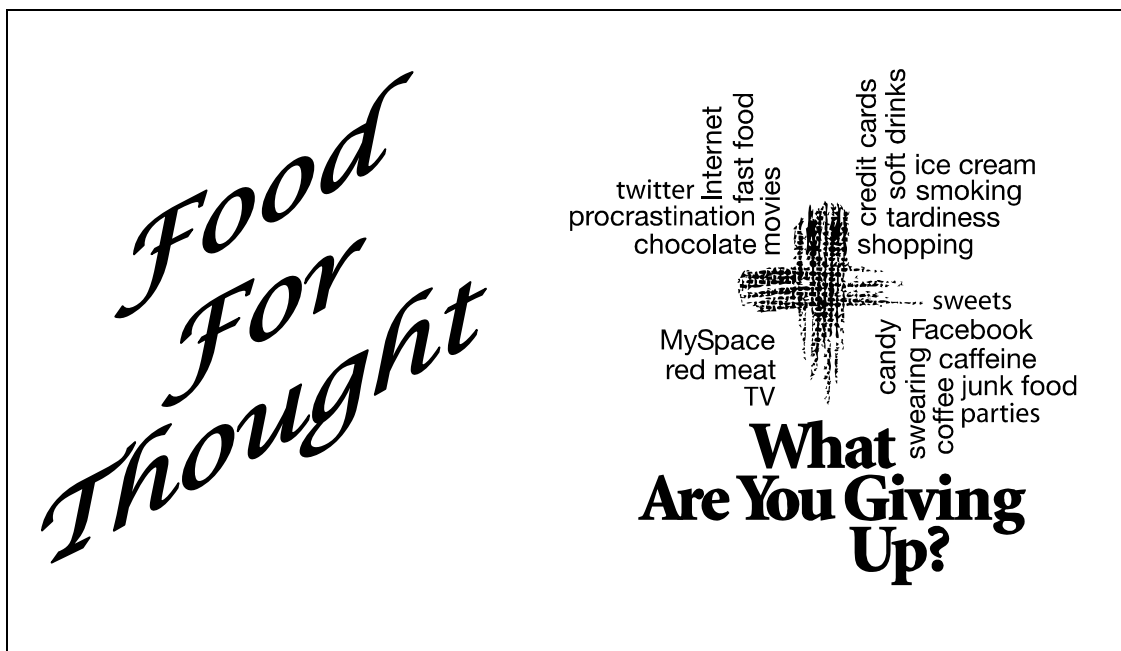

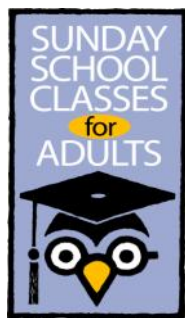
Revenue collected in January was very close to meeting Budget – this was a good start to the year. The monthly allocation of the 2011 Revenue Budget has been built to reflect the number of Sundays in the month (there were 5 Sundays in January) as well as the timing of Special Services (we celebrated Epiphany in January). In contrast, the February Budget will reflect 4 Sundays and no Special Services. In other words, we are trying to compare Revenue to a realistic expectation each month.

The Finance Committee and Council will be monitoring the Actual Year-to-Date Revenue versus Year-to-Date Revenue Budget closely in 2011. We will provide monthly updates in ReMarks and will communicate with you further in this and other mediums as circumstances warrant. We are committed to only spend the money that we bring in this year.

Your support and your input will help us manage our resources most effectively.

SOCIAL MINISTRY



LENTEN BOXES: Lent will begin Wednesday March 9th and with it comes our Lenten offering boxes. The portion Social Ministry can designate will go to SECOND HARVEST'S BACK PACK PROGRAM to feed hungry children. Second Harvest operates 79 backpack program sites in 14 counties, 20 sites in Mecklenburg County. The schools identify the children who will no doubt have little to eat at home over the weekend when free school meals are not available. The children receive a backpack on Friday to take home and return on Monday. These backpacks are filled with nutritious, easy to eat or heat food items that can also be shared with younger siblings or even parents. Nutrition is

essential and foods such as candy, cookies and chips (high sugar or fat foods) are never included. Examples of included foods are canned spaghetti, canned meats, raisins, nutra-grain bars, fruit cups and mac & cheese prepared by students at Johnson & Wales. The cost is approximately \$4.50 per backpack, \$234 feeds 1 child for a whole calendar year. No child should have to go hungry over the weekend so please help Second Harvest's Backpack Program make life a bit brighter for thousands of low-income children by filling your Lenten box to overflowing!
